






A broad view of heritage

Landscape Partnership Scheme

- schemes led by partnerships of local, regional and national interests which aim to conserve areas of distinctive landscape character
- £100,000 to £3million available
- Scheme area usually 20sqkm to 200sqkm
- Annual deadline (May)










Headlands to Headspace: Morecombe Bay's Landscape Partnership

Priorities:

- Landscape-scale management of fragmented coastal habitats
- Improved access for diverse audiences
- Substantial community engagement
- Training and volunteering opportunities
- Enjoyable learning for all ages



Heritage Grants

• Grants over £100,000

Projects last up to 5 years

Capital projects with activities OR activity-only projects

Min 5% match funding









Smaller scale funding

Sharing Heritage (£3,000 - £10,000)

Our Heritage (£10,000 - £100,000)

Young Roots (£10,000 - £50,000)





Key features

- Submit at any time
- Decision within 8 10 weeks
- No match funding



Who Can Apply?

Public or not-for-profit organisations such as:

- Community or voluntary groups
- Local authorities
- Other public sector organisations
- Parish Councils
- Charities

All organisations must have a constitution / set of rules and a bank account





"Stepping the Tinners' Way"

- The Tinners Way: 18 mile track following the ancient transportation routes for tine and copper between St Just and St Ives
- Schools and communities exploring history and heritage of the route
- Activities included oral histories; creative writing; film work; an exhibition
- Applicant: Tough Dough Cost: £9700



NCI Prawle Point Visitor Centre Refurbishment

- Repair of a NCI lookout originally built in 1860s
- Volunteers and heritage partners producing displays
- Education pack and guidebook
- Volunteers trained in hosting talks and guided walks

Applicant: North West Coastwatch Institution

Cost: £16600



Key issues

- Not seeking project enquiry advice
- Undefined (or poorly expressed) heritage focus
- Outcomes
- Lack of community engagement / support
- Value for money scope of project
- Legacy maintenance? Future costs?
