# The Sefton coast

- The Sefton Coast Partnership (SCP) was set up in the 1980's – under the name of Sefton Coast Management Scheme and became the SCP in 2001.






- In 2006 SCP decided to develop the Sefton Coast Landscape Partnership Scheme project through the Heritage Lottery Fund's Landscape Partnership programme.
- Initial project was submitted to HLF in 2008, after approval the second stage was submitted to HLF in late 2009 and approved in 2010.





# People

- Initial project had £414,000 of in-kind
- During the project we generated over £49,500 of in-kind above the requirements of the original project
- This equates to approximately 1000hrs

# Volunteer feedback

- 89% of volunteers said they know more about coastal monitoring as a result of volunteering
- 86% reported that their skills had increased as a result of volunteering
- All volunteers reported benefits from taking part
  - increased knowledge & practical skills
  - active way of life/exercise

  - meeting/chatting to other people
  - being able to pass on knowledge/skills to others.
